



 - Exaggeration does the author exaggerate something for intentional <u>effect</u> or emphasis?






"The acts of the sinful nature are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery; idolatry and witchcraft; hatred; discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions, and envy; drunkennes, orgies, and the like. I warn you, as I did before, that those who live like this will not inherit the Kingdom of God.

"So I say, live by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the sinful nature. For the sinful nature desires what is contrary to the Spirit, and the Spirit what is contrary to the sinful nature. They are in conflict with each other, so that you do not do what you want. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under law.

LEARN TO LOOK Look for what the Word <u>compares</u> . Simile Metaphor Allegory Look for instances where the author uses a certain <u>image</u> or comparison to communicate a deeper meaning in the text.	"Tell me, you who want to be under the law, are you not aware of what the law says? For it is written that Abraham had two sons, one by the slave woman and the other by the free woman. His son by the slave woman was born in the ordinary way, but his son by the free woman was born as the result of a promise.	"These things may be taken figuratively, for the women represent two covenants. One covenant is from Mount Sinai and bears children who are to be slaves No you, brothers, like Isaac, are children of promise."


